Resolved that the term of appointment for Bill Clarke to the Board of Assessment Review be from January 2010 to September 30th, 2014 with the actual term beginning October 1 of 2009.

Presentation:

Supervisor Lucia said Ed Knapik; a Census Recruiter from the Census Bureau was present to talk about the Census. Mr. Knapik said the Census takes place every 10 years and the purpose is to gather information that can be used by different offices of government, schools and business. Mr. Knapik said that the monies that local governments receive are based on the response from the Census. Mr. Knapik said he is responsible for the towns of Wilton, Corinth and Northumberland. His job is to recruit for enumerators. These individual will be required to take a test prior to employment. Mr. Knapik said he has three test sites; the Town Hall, the Senior Center and the Firehouse. Mr. Knapik said that he is in search of a training site that is available for classes Monday-Friday from 9-4pm that will hold about 20 people. The criteria needed to take the test are, the applicant must be 18 and if the applicant is a male he must be registered with the selective service. Applicants that are hired will work from May to August. Two forms of ID are required and one form must have a picture unless the applicant has a current passport. Veterans that have DD Form 214 and Disabled Veterans' with a letter indicating that they have a disability will earn extra points on the exam. Mr. Knapik said that the position pays \$13.00 an hour and .50¢ per mile.

Honoring Robert Dennis LeClerc

Motion Made by Councilman *Byrnes*

Whereas: The Town Board of Corinth, County of Saratoga, State of New York, wishes to pass a resolution honoring Robert Dennis LeClerc, and,

Whereas: Robert Dennis LeClerc was Born in Berlin, New Hampshire, on April 15, 1926, the son of Dennis and Yvonne LeClerc, Brother to Norman, and Lawrence, Brother-in-law to Nancy, and Father to Adrienne, Yvonne, and Lucinda. And,

Whereas: Robert Dennis LeClerc was a devoted and loving Grandfather to; Hillary, Jessica, Lizzie, Meagan, Emily, and Timmy, and a Special Grandpa to Jerica and Natalie.

Whereas: Mr. LeClerc Graduated from Corinth High School in 1943, and entered the United States Marine Corps July 10, 1944. and did overseas duty in the Pacific Area in the 3rd Marine Division Infantry Regiment, from November 12, 1944, to July 29, 1946, Iwo Jima Volcano Islands from, February 22, 1945 thru March 9, 1945, and China from December 19, 1945 to July 16, 1946, as a member of the First Marine Division. Robert was Honorably Discharged on August 12, 1946.

Whereas: Robert Dennis LeClerc returned home to marry the love of his life, Shirley Waldron LeClerc on June 26, 1948. He Entered Veterans Vocational School, now known as Hudson Valley Community College, and Graduated in 1952, with a degree in A.A.S. Radio Communications. Robert went to work for General Electric, as an Instrument Technician. He worked for General Electric for 34 years, retiring in April of 1986.

Whereas: Robert Dennis LeClerc, was a Family Man first and Foremost, but found time to Volunteer in his Community, He was a Member of the Horace D. Washburn Post # 533, K, Of C., Rotary Club, Village Trustee for Many Years, and a Trustee for the Immaculate Conception Church.

Whereas: Robert Dennis LeClerc left a huge void, not only with his family, but also in the entire community upon his passing June 29, 2009.
