Councilman Byrnes asked Supervisor Lucia if there were grants available to assist homeowners with roofs, windows and etc. on a trailer this year. Supervisor Lucia explained that the housing grant that the Town of Corinth received this year in the amount of \$300,000 was to assist those that own their home and land, and that all applications were being handled outside of the Town Hall. Supervisor Lucia explained that there were other resources that homeowners could use to have repairs made to their homes through Rebuilding Saratoga and through Saratoga County. Supervisor Lucia also stated that there were local churches that had means to assist homeowners with ramps and decks for accessibility reasons.

Supervisor Lucia informed the Town Board that the Saratoga County Fair would be held July 19-24th this year.

Supervisor Lucia stated that there would be no Town Board meeting on June 30th.

RESOLVED that the 2016 Saratoga County Trails Grant Submission Resolution as follows be approved:

2016 Saratoga County Trails Grant Submission

WHEREAS, the Village of Corinth Board of Trustees previously authorized the preparation of the Recreational Master Plan for the property in the Town of Corinth referred to as Corinth Reservoir Recreation Area; and

WHEREAS, the Draft Recreational Master Plan has recommended numerous improvements to enhance the Areas recreational benefits for visitors of all ages and abilities; and

WHEREAS, Saratoga County is accepting applications through their Saratoga County Trails Grant Program to fund trail related projects; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Corinth and the Town of Corinth are partnering to share costs and labor to implement recommendations from the Recreational Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, to help fund improvements at the Corinth Reservoir Recreation Area, the Village and Town of Corinth have agreed to submit a joint funding application to Saratoga County.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; the Town of Corinth Town Board authorizes the submission of a grant application to Saratoga County, seeking funds for specific improvements at the Corinth Reservoir Recreation Area in partnership with the Village of Corinth.

Rich Reuther presented the Corinth Town Board with EMS update. Mr. Reuther stated that they are almost 100% on having 2 crews 24 hours a day. Supervisor Lucia informed the Town Board that the paramedic overtime was way down this month since the newly hired EMT's have been scheduled and things are working out good.

Supervisor Lucia stated that Alicia Floud, Deputy Animal Control Officer, contacted him regarding a cat issue on 4th St. Supervisor Lucia stated that she has found an area rescue to assist with the care of these cats.

Supervisor Lucia stated that Animal Control Officer Delbert Clothier will be retiring on July 1, 2016.

Councilman Byrnes inquired on the plan for restroom usage this year for the 4th of July Celebrations.
