Sher Millis

Sher Millis presented to the Corinth Town Board a proposal to complete a mural on the wall on Hamilton Avenue across from White's Ace True Value, as well as complete a community garden on the property where the building was demolished, asking for support from the Town of Corinth. Ms. Millis stated this would be a 2 phase project with the mural completed this year and a community garden created in 2017. Presented was a sketch stating there was 499.1 sq. ft. of surface. Ms. Millis stated that the Village of Corinth contributed \$1000.00 towards materials and Ace True Value priced out the materials at \$732.55. Ms. Millis' total projected price for this project would be at a minimum of \$3750.00 to a maximum of \$5000.00.

Councilman Halliday inquired on the status of the property and if Ace True Value had intentions to sell the property in the future and what that would mean for the Community Garden if that occurred. Ms. Millis stated she spoke with the owner and that he had no intentions to sell that property in the near future. Ms. Millis stated that this mural she would like to be dedicated the women of Corinth, and passed along a photo shot of the Corinth Bridge as her proposal for the mural. Councilman Collura asked Ms. Millis how her other projects were funded. Ms. Millis explained that some were donations and others were free murals. Supervisor Lucia explained that this would be discussed with Town Council and that the Town Board would get back to her on this request.

Jim Martin-LA Group

Jim Martin spoke to the Corinth Town Board on matters of zoning and how the communication with the Zoning Secretary and himself was going very well. Mr. Martin explained his billing, and how each email and response regarding issues brought to him, are emailed back to the zoning secretary, Supervisor Lucia and often Code Enforcement Brooks. Mr. Martin stated that it was a pleasure working with Stachia Wagner as the zoning secretary.

Mr. Martin also asked the Corinth Town Board for permission to continue the work on the Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Corinth. He stated that it was last left off with copies given to each board member, and asked if they wanted to meet or for him to update them and meet to review. Supervisor Lucia stated that Jim Martin could compile a draft and that a workshop would be set to review his copy. Supervisor Lucia also stated that a community meeting would be set to hear concerns and suggestions.

Jim Martin also presented to the town board a law that area communities are adopting, Vacant Property Registry Law, and proposed that the Town of Corinth consider this. With this local law, the vacant bank owned properties would be on a registry and banks would be held accountable for maintaining the property during their ownership. Town Clerk Rose Farr stated she would request a copy of area laws and present them to the Town Board for review.

Alicia Floud-Deputy Animal Control Officer

Alicia Floud presented the Town Board with a letter thanking them for the opportunity to work as the Deputy Animal Control Officer for 4 years and requested being appointed to Animal Control Officer. Ms. Floud also presented to Town Board with a monthly report for June.

Richard Reuther

Paramedic Coordinator Richard Reuther presented the Town Board with his report. Mr. Reuther stated that the AC units in the rigs have been repaired, and that the new hires have began their physicals and drug testing with Center of Occupational Health. Mr. Reuther stated that 2 paramedics are out on medical leave for non-job related injuries and that he would keep the Town Board up to date on these employees.

Mr. Reuther informed the Town Board that he was notified that a paramedic's certification had lapsed and that he spoke with Dr. Jagoda and was advised not to allow this employee to work

without certification. Supervisor Lucia and the Town Board agreed with Dr, Jagoda’s decision and Mr. Reuther will advise this employee that he will not be allowed to work until his certification is valid.

Mr. Reuther also informed the Town Board of a volunteer that had taken their driving course with another medic and wanted to be signed off. The Corinth Town Board stated that the driving exams were to be given by Mr. Reuther and that this volunteer would not be signed off until that occurred.

Supervisor Lucia thanked the Corinth Image Committee for an outstanding 4th of July celebration. Supervisor Lucia requested a thank you letter be sent. Town Clerk Farr will prepare this letter.

Supervisor Lucia informed the Town Board that Roger Dayton had submitted a letter announcing his retirement effective 7/1/2016. After brief discussion with the Town Board, it was agreed to see if we incurred an issue with pests and rodents in the back offices now that the food pantry has re-located.
