RESOLVED that Charles Pasquarell be appointed as the Town of Corinth’s Member of the Saratoga County Fire Advisory Board.

Supervisor Lucia asked Justin Gonyea, who attended the meeting, for an update on the Railroad. Justin stated that the railway is now operating four days per week, Thursday through Sunday. This schedule will continue through the Fall of 2017. He said that the Fall Foliage rides will also continue on the 14th and 15th and the Christmas train will still be in the works. Also the Polar Express has plans of relocating with another entity.

Supervisor Lucia asked Justin how the public could purchase tickets and if the possibility of obtaining a time table as well for the schedules. Justin told the Board that his secretary would send up some schedules, and stated that the public could buy tickets online or at the reservation desk. Justin went on to tell the Board that 2017 has been a rough year and that the ridership was down. He explained different marketing ideas that will be hopefully implemented, such as freight and lumber contracts. Justin reassured the Board that the railway will continue to service the town for the next four years and has not heard of any talk of severing the Corinth contract.

Supervisor Lucia proudly announced the Corinth Playground would be starting next week. The new Director Jackie Sarnelli and Assistant Director Destiny Kloss, who worked with Annaliese Statuner, would be working. Due to a state law the days and hours are limited to three days the first week and two days the second week. Hours will be 9AM-1PM, with an EOC free lunch.
