HIKING CHALLENGE PRESENTATION: Jennifer Kietzman/Dave Bourque/Dan Smith Jennifer Kietzman is putting together the Corinth Hiking Challenge. She has also considered naming it the Gateway to the Adirondacks Challenge. She has received some information from Dave Bourque-Brant Lake Challenge and Dan Smith-Chester Challenge. The Challenge would consist of the following 8 Hikes.

Saratoga County:

*Corinth Reservoir Recreation Area:

Upper Reservoir Trail to Western Ridge Trail to Beaver Pond Trail

*Spruce Mountain Trail (fire tower)

*Lake Bonita Loop and/or Lake Bonita to Lake Ann Loop

*Moreau Lake State Park Trails:

Western Ridge Trail

Baker Trail to Moreau Lake Overlook Trail

Stonewall Trail

*Hadley Mountain Trail (fire tower)

Warren County:

*Potash Mountain Trail

The main challenge would be the 8- Hikes and once completed the hiker would receive an embroidered patch, a window decal and will be assigned a number. They will also offer a 4- hike challenge. This would help to reinvent Corinth, add to

local tourism, and bring healthy activity to the community. A website would be set up for hikes, maps, photos & registration fees. The fees would help to sustain the challenge. The website would also have promotional items.

Dave Bourque has been working on the Brant Lake Challenge for 3 years and is amazed at what Jennifer has accomplished in 1 year. Goal- community---market it and people will return.

Dan Smith has been working for 8 years with the Chester Challenge. They have kept track of sign-ins and have had 52,000 visits. Brochures are a good way to bring people in. They have kept their challenges family friendly. They have also offered winter challenges. The town pays Dan around \$4,000 per year to maintain the trails with volunteers.

Supervisor Butler stated that all of the costs would be 100% reimbursable to the Town by applying for a grant from the County. This falls into line with the Corinth Healthy Coalition.

Councilman Halliday—Love this idea. Hears about people hiking for patches all the time. Like the Gateway to the Adirondacks title for the challenge.

Supervisor Butler would like to apply for the Grant with the Boards approval and would like regular updates as to how the challenge is going.

RESOLUTION #125

Resolution No. 125 of 2023

Resolution Opposing Passage of Conservation Subdivision Design Bill A04608

- **WHEREAS**, The Adirondack Park Agency adopted a Large Subdivision Permit application that incorporated many of the action items in the Conservation Subdivision Design Bill, and
- **WHEREAS**, implementation of the Adirondack Park Agency Large Subdivision Permit is possibly more protective of the Environment than the Conservation Subdivision Design allows for, and
- **WHEREAS**, Conservation Design laws are seldom mandatory, and are a tool to keep open space in urban areas, and
- **WHEREAS**, there are more than 3.3 million acres of the 5.9-million-acre Adirondack Park that will never be developed or subdivided, and
- **WHEREAS**, of the remaining 2.6 million acres of private land, existing development, roads, lakes, rivers, streams, steep slopes, wetlands and high elevations render most of these areas as not suitable for development, and
- **WHEREAS**, bill number A04608 has been introduced in the New York State Assembly, and said bill would require Adirondack Park residential subdivisions that meet specific lot size thresholds to comply with certain conservation subdivision design criteria, and
- **WHEREAS**, the proposed legislation would amend the existing Adirondack Park Agency Act, which has been in effect for 50 years, and
- WHEREAS, before major Adirondack Park Agency permit application processes are changed, a public hearing process needs to be implemented so that property owners have an

opportunity to understand and comment on how this proposed law will affect their property values, and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation would require private property owners to incur undue burdens in order to complete additional ecological assessments associated with proposed developments, and

WHEREAS, this proposed legislation could eliminate the potential for development on certain lands, constituting a "taking" without compensation, when current law already protects and provides for regulation of these same lands by the Adirondack Park Agency, and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation places additional burdens on property owners that are not necessary to protect environmental and ecological systems and are not beneficial to the well-being of the Adirondack Park and its residents.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Corinth does not approve of the proposed legislation, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Corinth hereby calls upon our local governments to stand together, individually and through our associations, to insist that the Conservation Subdivision Design Bill (A04608) be withdrawn, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochul, Senate Majority Stewart-Cousins, Senator Stec, Senator Griffo, Senator Walczyk, Senator Tedisco, Assembly Speaker Heastie, Assemblyman Jones, Assemblyman Simpson, Assemblyman Smullen, Assemblyman Blankenbush, Adirondack Intercounty, Adirondack Local Government Review Board and the Chairs of the Encon Committees Senator Harckham, and Assemblywoman Glick.

WHEREAS, the legislation clearly states the information to be included in the application for a one-day officiant license and requirements, and has entitled the clerk to collect a twenty-five dollar fee for the service to be retained by the Town; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk will be accepting applications for One-Day Marriage Officiants and collecting a twenty-five dollar fee.
