*Regarding Dog control services for Hadley, Jennifer suggested placing a clause in the contract if milage goes over agreement.

*Healthy Corinth Coalition: Working on the "May" mental health program. Looking to schedule when and where to have it.

James Anderson:

*Any updates for the 9N Project? Councilwoman Crooks and Supervisor Butler share the following: There will be 3 phases to this project. The Town is waiting for some guidance as to how to move forward using the grant received for phase one. The first phase will include a parking lot, youth fields, and walking paths. The permitting process still must be completed. The Town will share the next steps outside of this meeting.

Jennifer Michelle asked if the Town was working with Saratoga Plan as they are great to work with. No, the Town is not working with Saratoga Plan. Jennifer asked about the wetlands on the property and if any trails would be made there. There is an environmental review required, and no wetlands will have paths. Jennifer also offered her help with pollinator resources.

Mr. Anderson: will the trails have a 100ft buffer line from the surrounding residents.

Larz Anderson: Asked about the IP Property? Is it private and has there been effort by the State to take over the slug dump. He stated that 15 years ago the previous administration had formed an economic development committee, and nothing seemed to be done. There are mostly senior citizens in town, and they are struggling. The young people are leaving because there is nothing to keep them here. Supervisor Butler stated that the IP property is private and owned by IP. Councilwoman Crooks stated that the Town Board is working hard to get things done in the Town and that there are many things in the works.

Mr. Anderson also suggested a warning sign on the Town Side of Main Street prior to the Stop sign at Eggleston St.
